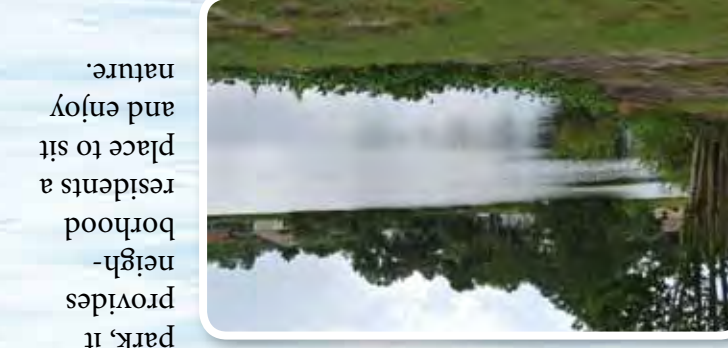

**1 LONG CREEK NATURE PRESERVE PADDLING TRAIL**

Length: 9 Acres

Long Creek Nature Preserve is located on Palm Harbor Parkway next to College Waterway Bridge, the preserve is about nine acres in size, connected to the 225-acre Long Creek Basin. Park features include pathways and boardwalks, canoe and kayak launches into Long Creek and College Waterway, and a fishing pier along College Waterway with a floating dock for boat mooring. Future plans will include an Environmental Educational Center at the preserve. No restroom facilities available.



**Getting 'In and Out of a Kayak with Ease!**

- Place your paddle shaft behind (or in front) of the cockpit opening, across the deck
- Holding the paddle shaft in place, gently lean on one side to let that paddle blade rest on the ground - this will keep the kayak from wobbling
- Using the paddle shaft to steady you - quickly enter the center of the cockpit - crouch - then sit
- Then use your paddle to give you a shove off
- Getting out is the same in reverse

- Safety Tips:**
- Wear your life jacket! Each person operating, riding on, or being towed behind a personal watercraft must wear an approved non-inflatable Type I, II, III or V personal flotation device (PFD). Inflatable PFDs are prohibited for personal watercraft use.
  - Check local weather forecast before heading out onto the water.
  - Some launch sites are tidally influenced so be sure to check tide charts before adventuring out.
  - Along the shoreline, watch for sharp shells and oyster mounds.
  - Dress comfortably, wear sturdy shoes and bring a whistle.
  - Be sure to check tide charts before heading out.
